

## With funding from Congress through the CARES Act, the Mississippi Humanities Council launched an emergency grant program in April 2020 to help support cultural organizations affected by the COVID-19 crisis. The Council received \$460,000 to redistribute across the state as CARES \$47.320 **Emergency Grants, providing unrestricted** operational expenses up to \$20,000 for

humanities-focused cultural nonprofit organizations for up to two months. "We were very pleased to be able to direct these federal emergency funds to help the

institutions that preserve and document Mississippi's unique cultural heritage while enriching the quality of life in our communities. Our goal was to use these federal relief funds to bolster employment in our state's cultural economy while helping these organizations 'keep the lights on' during this time of unprecedented challenges." 
